***Note:** Curriculum must meet elements outlined in the Coalition's Position Paper on Curriculum: must be based in theory, research, address the standards and be developmentally appropriate. Curriculums can be combined to create a comprehensive program. School Readiness program providers may use other combinations of curriculum materials not on this list, however they must first meet with a Coalition quality program staff to discuss it and demonstrate how it meets the standards and is developmentally appropriate. The Coalition program manager will determine if an alternative selected curriculum is allowable.*

*VPK providers are allowed to use whatever curriculum they chose **unless** their kindergarten readiness rate scores fall into the low performing category, at which point their site must use a curriculum approved by DOE. See DOE OEL website for this listing and procedures.*

VPK Providers must complete the required VPK form indicating how their chosen curriculum relates to the VPK standards.

As DOE and/or AWI/OEL issues new guidance or a recommended or approved list of curriculum, then the Coalition will update and revise its list. As new information and research is released, it will also be revised.
