Bullies Never Win – Cuyler, Margery (2009)

First-grader Jessica worries about everything Brenda the bully might tease her about, until the day she has had enough and discovers a new way to deal with Brenda.

Coat of Many Colors – Parton, Dolly (1994)

A poor girl delights in her coat of many colors, made by her mother from rags, because despite the ridicule of the other children she knows the coat was made with love.

Dinosaur Chase! – Blathwayt, Benedict (2006)

Fin the dinosaur is different than the other dinosaurs--smaller, weaker, and covered in fluff--but when he is chased over a cliff by relentless bullies, he makes an unexpected discovery about himself.

Ira Sleeps Over – Waber, Bernard (1972)

A little boy is excited at the prospect of spending the night at his friend's house but worries how he'll get along without his teddy bear.

Jungle Bullies – Kroll, Steven (2006)

To get what they want, the larger jungle animals bully the smaller ones until Mama Monkey shows them all the benefits of sharing.

The Little Bit Scary People – Jenkins, Emily (2008)

Some people are a little bit strange or a little too loud, and just a little bit scary. But I bet if you knew them, and knew their favorite things, you'd think that maybe, (probably) most people aren't so scary after all.

Lucy and the Bully – Alexander, Claire (2008)

When a mean classmate in preschool wrecks Lucy's artwork, she discovers that they can be friends once he stops being jealous of her.

Nobody Knew What to Do: A Story About Bullying – McCain, Becky (2001)

When bullies pick on a boy at school, a classmate is afraid, but decides that he must do something.

Recess Queen – O'Neill, Alexis (2002)

Mean Jean is the biggest bully on the school playground until a new girl arrives and challenges Jean's status as the Recess Queen.

Say Something – Moss, Peggy (2004)

A child who never says anything when other children are being teased or bullied finds herself in their position one day when jokes are made at her expense and no one speaks up.

Stand Tall, Molly Lou Melon – Lovell, Patty (2001)

Even when the class bully at her new school makes fun of her, Molly remembers what her grandmother told her and she feels good about herself.

Star of the Circus – Sampson, Michael (1997)

Each circus animal is pushed off the stage by a bigger animal until they learn that they all are stars in the circus.

Trouble Talk – Ludwig, Trudy (2008)

Maya gets help from a school counselor when the new student she has tried to befriend upsets her, as she has other students, by spreading rumors, saying hurtful things, and sharing information that is not hers to share.
