*Note: Curriculum must meet elements outlined in the Coalition's Position Paper on Curriculum: must be based in theory and research, address the Florida Standards and be developmentally appropriate. Curricula can be combined to create a comprehensive program. School Readiness program providers may use other combinations of curriculum materials not on this list, however they must first meet with a Coalition quality program staff to discuss their approach and demonstrate how it meets the standards and is developmentally appropriate. The Coalition program manager will determine if an alternative selected curriculum is allowable.*

*Providers participating in the Look for the Stars Quality Improvement System are expected to have **six hours of training in their chosen curriculum by the 2011 assessment.***

*VPK providers are allowed to use the curriculum of their choice as long as the chosen curriculum can be shown to address all domains in the Florida VPK Education Standards. If a VPK provider's kindergarten readiness rate falls into the low performing category the VPK provider must use a curriculum approved by DOE. See DOE OEL website for this listing and procedures.*

*VPK Providers must complete the required VPK form indicating how their chosen curriculum relates to the VPK standards.*

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*As DOE and/or AWI/OEL issues new guidance or a recommended or approved list of curriculum, then the Coalition will update and revise its list. As new information and research is released, it will also be revised.*

#### **Resources:**

Character development may be supported through incorporation of materials related to universal mental health support of young children – i.e. materials from the Center on the Social and Emotional Foundations for Early Learning (CSEFE), challenging behavior support strategies, etc.
